



## Leading Edge Credit Union Award

### Rationale

To support the students at Appalachia High School, the Leading Edge Credit Union will present a \$100.00 award to a deserving **Grade 9** student.

### Selection Criteria

Applicants for this award must submit a résumé on or before **Friday, May 29, 2015** to the Principal, Vice-Principal or Guidance Counsellor that meets the following criteria:

- passing all courses.
- show evidence of leadership in the school and in the community.
- submit a copy of their most recent report card.

Appalachia High will select a committee of teachers to review the submitted applicants and choose the successful candidate. If there is no successful candidate, the money will not be awarded for that year. The school will be notified yearly of any change to the value of the award.

## Royal Canadian Legion Branch 38 Annual Scholarship

### Rationale

To support the students at Appalachia High School, Branch 38 of the Royal Canadian Legion will award annually one scholarship to a deserving student in each of the high school levels. These scholarships will be awarded in the spring of each year. The value of each scholarship is:

Gr. 9 - \$100

Level 1 - \$200

Level 2 - \$300

Level 3 - \$500

### Selection Criteria

Applicants for these scholarships must submit a résumé by **Friday, May 29, 2015** to the Principal, Vice-Principal or Guidance Counsellor that meets the following criteria:

- passing all courses whether in the Basic or Academic program.
- show evidence of leadership in the school and in the community.
- submit a copy of the midterm report card.

Appalachia High will select a committee of teachers to review the submitted applicants and choose a successful candidate from each grade level. If there is no successful candidate for a particular grade level, the scholarship will not be awarded for that year. The value of each scholarship will remain the same unless the Legion deems it necessary to change the value. The school will be notified of any change to the value of the scholarship at the beginning of the school year.



## St. George's Indian Band Annual Scholarship

### Rationale

To support the students at Appalachia High School, the St. George's Indian Band will award annually one \$500.00 scholarship to a deserving Level 3 student. This scholarship will be awarded at the June awards ceremony.

### Selection Criteria

Applicants for this scholarship must submit their information by **Friday, May 29, 2015** to the Principal, Vice-Principal or Guidance Counsellor.

The criteria for this scholarship is as follows:

- Student is passing all courses whether in the Basic or Academic program.
- Student is a member of the St. George's Indian Band
- Student must submit a resume explaining their involvement with their culture
- Student must submit an essay or a display or a project on the following topic:

### ***What being an aboriginal means to me.***

The St. George's Indian Band will review the submitted applicants and choose a successful candidate. If there is no successful candidate, the scholarship will not be awarded for that year. The value of the scholarship will remain the same unless the Band Council deems it necessary to change the value. The school will be notified of any change to the value of the scholarship at the beginning of the school year.

# **Appalachia High School Teachers' Scholarship**

This award is supported by the teaching staff at Appalachia. The amount of the award will vary from year to year. Students must submit an application in order to be considered for this award. This scholarship will be awarded at the Cap and Gown ceremony.

## Criteria

- Completing Level 3 this academic year.
- An average of 80% in the following level 3 courses: Academic/Advanced Math, English, Science (Chemistry or Biology) and World Geography or French. Official Dept. of Education transcript will be used to calculate the average.
- Registered at a post-secondary institution for the fall semester.
- Submit a 300-500 word essay on why you feel you should be awarded this scholarship.
- Essay must be submitted by the last day of school to the Principal or Vice-Principal.

The successful candidate(s) must submit written proof of registration at a post-secondary institution. In the event of a tie, the award will be divided equally.
